WORSHIP CALENDAR FOR OCTOBER 2022

[Our Souls Matters Theme of the month is "The Path of Courage." A few question that you might ask yourself in exploring the theme: Who in your own life showed you most about courage? Have you ever found hidden resources of courage in you that you didn't know that you had? What is your definition of courage? Use these or come up with other questions to discuss with your family, friends or work partners.]

October 2nd "Courage is a Heart Thing" (Rev. Michael F. Hall) Our first service of the month is on courage as a "heart thing" a prime moral driver of action, an indicator of virtue and pathway to righteous action. What this might say about reason is an interesting question. This service will feature a Time for All Ages and the speaking of our Joys & Concerns

October 9th "Comfortable Courage (Is That a Thing?)" (Rev. Michael) Can courage and comfort peacefully coexist? Or are the two so incompatible that placed side to side they naturally create and oxymoron. Can we have enough courage to resist creating injustice and setting up systems of oppression. Can we be comfortable enough to say "enough is enough," that the ultimate peace is everyone having enough. This service will also feature a Time for All Ages, the KUUC Choir and a message about the UUA Annual Program Fund.

October 16th "Make Me An Instrument Of Your Peace" (Matt Aversa) In our world today, we all seek peace. We are all concerned about the health of our planet and that concern extends to the creatures that share our lives. Our pets bring us joy and comfort and St. Francis knew this. He shared a deep respect for all of Creation and sought peace among people. Join Matt Aversa today, share your hope for peace in our troubled world and to celebrate the blessing of our beloved pets by bringing a picture or stuffed animal to the service. Besides the animal blessing this service will also include a brief message about the UUA Annual Program Fund and why it is so important.

October 23rd "Arthur Sweetser, The League of Nations and the UN" (Jim Smart) As a young scholar, our own Jim Smart had the opportunity to work on the papers of Arthur Sweetser, a publicist for President Woodrow Wilson as he sought to make his cherished vision of a League of Nations a reality. **This Service will feature the KUUC Choir.**

October 30th "The Ordinary Courage of the Ancestors" (Rev. Michael) It is customary in many traditions for the people to remember and celebrate their ancestors at this time of year. So today, through words, stories, music and of course the tolling of our church bell we will remember our spiritual, intellectual, ethnic and familial ancestors and the members and friends of KUUC who parted the curtain between the life that is known and the mystery of whatever is next. **This Service includes a special Time for All Ages and the bell-tolling ritual.**

Lately I have been thinking a great deal about courage, not because of anything related to my life at present, but because it is our Soul Matters theme of the month and I realize that I don't really know much about it. I have met people who I imagined

must be courageous for the things they did, or survived. I have met plenty of folks who have shared with me about brave things they did of which I had no reason to doubt their truthfulness. On more than one occasion I found myself judging people as fabricators but maybe I just lacked the grace to believe they were anything more than braggarts---some I judged even less charitably than that.

When it comes to courage, I do think that there are many things that could be said about it, and they would seem spot on; I also think that someone else might say the exact opposite and I would have to agree that they hit the nail right on the head. The Hemingway quote above seems true. The world does break everyone, some much

worse than others with all its loss, trauma, its violence and lost loves. Maybe those things make us stronger in the broken places, maybe we just break somewhere else the next time.

In an interview with Dorothy Parker, Hemingway said that "courage is grace under pressure." To me there seems a golden vein of truth running through those words, because it doesn't say you survive a hardship, a beatdown or some lifechanging shock; it simply says you bear up to it with grace, and, if the opportunity presents itself, you move on, move ahead, maybe even into a better place.

The Keene Unitarian Church has a long tradition of making Berry Bowls for sale at the Green Sale. It is a fun activity to take part in as we gather together to celebrate the season and enjoy the seasonal transition.

A sequence of steps is involved in making the Berry Bowls and these happen over a few weeks. You and your family are invited to take part in one or two or all of the steps and enjoy the fun and be helpful in creating the holiday Berry Bowls.

Step #1 Sunday, Oct. 30th from 1-3. Gather berries and moss at Larry and Suzanne Butcher's home at 44 Felt Rd., Keene.

Step #2 Saturday, Nov. 5th from 10-Noon. Gather at the church to make the berry bowls as a group. Bowls will be lightly covered and stored for three weeks in a cool environment and misted weekly.
