Our Seven UU Principles are not dogma or doctrine, but rather a covenant made between our Unitarian Universalist congregations around the world. Many of our members use "The Principles" as a guide for how they choose to live their faith at home and in their communities.

**1st Principle:** The inherent worth and dignity of every person

**2nd Principle:** Justice, equity and compassion in human relations

3rd Principle: Acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our

congregations

**4th Principle:** A free and responsible search for truth and meaning

**5th Principle:** The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our

congregations and in society at large

**6th Principle:** The goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all

**7th Principle:** Respect for the interdependent web of existence of which we are a part

#### THE SIX SOURCES OF OUR LIVING TRADITION

As religious pluralists we draw upon multiple sources of inspiration in worship and daily life including:

Direct experience of that transcending mystery and wonder, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces that create and uphold life;

Words and deeds of prophetic people, which challenge us to confront powers and structures of evil with justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love;

Wisdom from the world's religions, which inspires us in our ethical and spiritual life;

Jewish and Christian teachings, which call us to respond to God's love by loving our neighbors as ourselves;

Humanist teachings, which counsel us to heed the guidance of reason and the results of science and warn us against idolatries of the mind and spirit;

Spiritual teachings of Earth-centered traditions, which celebrate the sacred circle of life and instruct us to live in harmony with the rhythms of nature.

#### MAKING BERRY BOWLS --- A KUIUC TRADITION

The Keene Unitarian Church has a long tradition of making Berry Bowls for sale at the Green Sale. It is a fun activity to take part in as we gather together to celebrate the season and enjoy the seasonal transition.

A sequence of steps is involved in making the Berry Bowls and these happen over a few weeks. You and your family are invited to take part in one or two or all of the steps and enjoy the fun and be helpful in creating the holiday Berry Bowls.

Step #1 Sunday, Oct. 30<sup>th</sup> from 1-3. Gather berries and moss at Larry and Suzanne Butcher's home at 44 Felt Rd., Keene.

Step #2 Saturday, Nov. 5<sup>th</sup> from 10-Noon. Gather at the church to make the berry bowls as a group. Bowls will be lightly covered and stored for three weeks in a cool environment and misted weekly.

Step #3 Sunday, Nov. 27<sup>th</sup> after church. Gather to seal the bowls, add bows and price the bowls. They are put in the church kitchen windows to 'perk up' until the green sale.

Step #4 Friday and Saturday, Dec. 2nd and 3<sup>rd</sup> Set up a table at the Green Sale and help sell the Berry Bowls.
