#### THE SIX SOURCES OF OUR LIVING TRADITION

As religious pluralists we draw upon multiple sources of inspiration in worship and daily life including:

Direct experience of that transcending mystery and wonder, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces that create and uphold life;

Words and deeds of prophetic people, which challenge us to confront powers and structures of evil with justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love;

Wisdom from the world's religions, which inspires us in our ethical and spiritual life;

Jewish and Christian teachings, which call us to respond to God's love by loving our neighbors as ourselves;

Humanist teachings, which counsel us to heed the guidance of reason and the results of science and warn us against idolatries of the mind and spirit;

Spiritual teachings of Earth-centered traditions, which celebrate the sacred circle of life and instruct us to live in harmony with the rhythms of nature.

#### SHARING MINISTRY: DECEMBER 2022

Children of this Season of Wonder,

I need your help. It seems that I have misplaced my sense of wonder, which I depend on quite a lot not just in my work among you: creating stories and prayers and messages, being the person

who tries to keep an eye on what we could become (the forest) and not simply what we have always been or need to do (the trees).

If we cannot live in body without a beating heart or functioning brain, then I would add that we cannot live in a world such as ours with all its problems and possibilities without a full and active sense of wonder. Wonder is a punch, the kind like you drink at a gathering, not the one that foolish people think will solve disputes, (yet usually make them worse). Wonder is a punch made of the best things: curiosity, love, playfulness and imagination.

We all have it, wonder, and though it is often associated with children for whom even the most ordinary things become incomparable: a stick a butter becomes a sculpture, a cat washing herself an incredible feat or a spoon, (oh my goodness a spoon!). A spoon in a toddler's hands is a shovel, pike, telescope and a magic wand, etc!

I would have you know that all of us are children of wonder---no matter our age. It is easier perhaps for youngsters but often as they grow older and learn "facts" and the "(newest) new math. Then they gain more experiences and give themselves over screens and technologies that aren't as often used to inspire as to sell or create a agreed upon "groupthink." So, the sense of wonder needs to be cultivated throughout our lives, exercised daily, expanded, pushed and pulled, used to create better lives, technologies and ways of being human.

Fun thing. I found my sense of wonder as I was writing this message. Don't forget to keep yours right in front you; wonder is essential for both dreamers and doers.
